#### 1063/2022 Chair's Welcome & Announcements

Cllr Edwards (Chairman) welcomed residents to the Public Meeting of the Parish Council and delivered Health and Safety housekeeping rules.

Mr James Crocker advised that a number of appeals had been submitted to Cornwall Council concerning the withdrawal of the Concessionary School rides to Landulph School. The Appeals addressed the decision taken by the Assessors that the walk route was safe. Parents prepared for a protest walk with media coverage from Cornwall Live.

Cllr Fletcher advised that the Freedom of Information request sent to Cornwall Council and the response only revealed that an 'assessor had walked the route'.

## **B** Cllr Malcolm Fletcher – Climate and Ecological Emergency

Cllr Fletcher reported as follows-

- Landmark Tree delivery of new replacement tree awaited.
- Rumbullion Farm have offered to the Parish Council several oak saplings.
- Forest for Cornwall distributing free trees to householders in several Parishes (West Cornwall). Trees to be offered to other parts of Cornwall next year.
- Bulb planting 100 miniature daffodil bulbs to be planted on the Recreation field banks.
- Reference to COP27 summit (no reduction in fossil fuels use)
- Reference to COP27 summit (alternative farming methods needed to address degradation of soils.
